Making and Receiving Calls

The dial pad on the left of your Teams application allows you to enter phone numbers and place calls.

When someone calls you, you'll get a Teams notification which allows you to answer or decline the call.

Access your call history and quickly call anyone back from the list. Go to the main calling icon and review the Call History section in the center of the screen. Select any item from the list and then choose **Call** in the Details section on the right side of Teams.

Voicemail

To setup and change your voicemail settings, select **Settings** next to your profile picture at the top of the Teams app and then choose **Calls**.

In the Voicemail section, select **Configure voicemail**. This is where you'll find all your voicemail settings.

To record a new voicemail greeting, select **Record a greeting** and follow the instructions to record your message.





& Call

Select the Play icon underneath the transcription to listen to your voicemail.

Select the call icon to call someone back right from your voicemail.



In-Call Options



Select the "More Actions" icon while on a call to access available options.

Placing a Caller on Hold - Select the Hold icon to activate. Everyone on the call will be notified if the call has been put on hold. Callers will hear music when placed on hold. You can continue the call by selecting "Resume".

Transferring a Call - Select the Transfer icon. Start typing the name or phone number of the person you want to transfer the call to. Then select Transfer.

Consultative (Warm) Transfer - Select the Consult then Transfer icon. Under "Choose a person to consult", start typing the name of the person and select them when they appear. Consult with them by calling or using chat. When you're ready, hit Transfer.
